WEV continues to focus on increasing access to capital and providing skillsbased programs for those in our community. In 2023, WEV's program highlights included:

- Continuing the Business of Childcare course, designed to increase affordable and accessible childcare options, and elevate household incomes for childcare business owners;
- Introducing a digital marketing course, designed to help business owners get online and lessen the digital divide made apparent during the pandemic;
- Expanding the Emprendimiento program to increase Spanishlanguage business resources and micro-grants for Hispanic business owners;
- Providing no-cost financial literacy education through the Financial Literacy Advisory Group, a collaboration of local nonprofits, banking partners, and organizations dedicated to offering accessible financial education to individuals in the community.

Thanks to your generosity, WEV offers its programs and services at a greatly reduced cost to the client, keeping them accessible to all. Like many non-profits, however, WEV is facing a challenging post-pandemic funding environment. 

## Elevating Women and Fueling the Local Economy

Your investment in women accelerates change in the community. Your support ensures resources are available at low to no-cost to women seeking financial independence through entrepreneurship, resulting in more jobs, revenue creation, and a stronger local economy.



In the last five years, your investment enabled WEV to assist **1,278 businesses** that created or sustained **3,501 jobs**, generated **\$147M in sales** and **\$12.5M in local tax revenue.** 



Your social return on investment is strong.

Every \$1 you donate to WEV generates \$15 in the local economy.



68% of returning clients report an increase in household income.



76% of WEV-assisted businesses report an increase in sales within five years.



#### 34% of WEV-assisted Woman-Owned Businesses are employer-firms with at least one employee + the owner, compared to 10% nationally.


